## From the Test Director: Update on Smarter Balanced Reporting Embargo:

Thank you all for respecting our embargo on public release of Smarter Balanced results. I've been interested in the many uses you've found for the quick turn of student test scores, and to the best of our knowledge all schools in Vermont adhered to our shared commitment to use data without releasing it.

Now that we are closing in on the end of testing, we are ready to remove the embargo in three steps:

- **On or After June 1 - Individual Student Reports May Be Released**
- **On or After June 20 – Preliminary School and District Level Results May Be Released (with caution, see below)**
- **Mid-August to Early September – State Results Will Be Released**

I've received a few gentle nags from schools that would like to send home the Smarter Balanced Individual Student Reports with end of the year report cards. I'm happy to announce that will be possible, but need to remind you that since teachers may not be available to discuss results with parents, please make sure to include the [Parent Report Guide](#) that can be downloaded from the Assessment Portal. You will also find directions on the portal for [batch printing](#) the Individual Student Reports.

We also recognize that there may be legitimate reasons why a school or district may want to have group level test data available before statewide results come out later in the summer. As long as you can account for all of your students you may generate those reports in the Online Reporting System once the testing window closes on June 20<sup>th</sup>. However, I do need to offer a note of caution. Once the Agency has finalized the spring census data we will make corrections to your Smarter Balanced files to account for students who have received health exemptions, students who participated in the DLM assessment instead of Smarter Balanced, and other additions or deletions that will result from the participation verification process. Based on the census, we will also update student demographic information including things such as IEP or Free-Reduced lunch status. For these reasons, you should label any results you release as "preliminary" and be prepared for instances where the final state results may be different from your preliminary analysis. Also, to ensure confidentiality, you are prohibited from releasing public reports on groups that have less than 10 students.

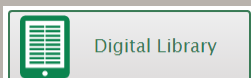
