From the Test Director: New Year & Assessment Updates/Changes

The Agency of Education's Assessment Team wishes you a happy New Year and high test scores from this spring's administration of the Smarter Balanced Assessments. Starting with this issue, we plan to publish the assessment newsletter every other week until early March and then weekly once the assessment window opens on March 14th. Please let us know if there are specific topics you think we should address.

Here are a few changes to this year's assessment we want to bring to your attention:

- **Classroom Activities** will no longer be a required part of administering the performance tasks. All new performance tasks developed by the Smarter Consortium will have key contextual information embedded in the task. Review of data on the original performance tasks indicates that classroom activities make little or no difference in students' ability to complete tasks successfully. So, in the interest of keeping testing time as short as possible we have eliminated this requirement.
- **Estimates for Testing Time** have been revised to reflect the absence of the classroom activities, as well as data taken during the first two administrations of the assessment. You should allow at least 6 hours for students in grades 3-5 to take the test, 6.5 hours for grades 6-8 and 7 hours for grade 11. Keep in mind that those estimates are for actual testing and do not include time needed for setting up the test session, entering ticket numbers, and other activities you might use to engage students. You can find the new test time estimates on pages 15 and 16 of the newly revised [Test Administration Manual](#).
- **Embedded Field Test Items and Performance Tasks** will be included in some of your student's assessments. However, neither you nor your students will be able to tell if they have been assigned one of these questions. The field test items also will not impact scores. I just thought you might want to know.
- **Airways** is a new analysis and reporting tool that is available for the interim assessments. Those of you who miss the item analysis reports that were part of the NECAP reporting system should take a look at Airways. Among the new reporting options, this is the one that allows educators to view the actual test items that students got right and wrong.
- **AIR's Mobile Testing Application** has been upgraded so that it is now fully functional with iOS 10.2. As you may know, there were some security flaws in iOS 10.0 and 10.1 that Apple fixed with 10.2. AIR will discontinue support for versions 10.0 and 10.1 as of January 31, 2017.

Special Programs and High School Testing

In the past, the Assessment Team has encountered many scenarios in which students might not test during their 11th grade year. Because there are many scenarios that may cause a delay in testing the Assessment Team handles assessment postponement requests on a case-by-case basis. That being said, there are two general groups in which these students tend to be categorized.

- First, the student is not on a graded program.
- Second, the student began the year as a 10th grader, but received enough credits to promote mid-year to the 11th grade.

Essentially the two basic criteria needed to qualify for the 11th grade testing are:

- the student has completed the 10th grade program, or
- it's the first year a student is classified as a junior in high school.

TTS Accommodations on Interim Assessments

If you have a student in grades 3-5 and would like to use the Text-to-Speech (accommodation - passages) on the interim assessment, please contact Linda Moreno to have the accommodation temporarily turned on. There is no approval process for interims; however,

Question of the Week: Do I need to be certified in order to administer the interim assessments?

Yes. Because Interim Assessments are accessed through TIDE, all users will need to be certified prior to administering the interim assessments. Certification is the method in which the state can prove to the federal government that everyone who is administering the assessment is trained, and that the training is consistent across the state. Much like the past, the total time to recertify will take approximately 15-20 minutes.
